All hardware and software is designed in-house, with outsourcing used for key manufacturing processes. We manage the supply chain of components and processes used in manufacture ourselves in order to maintain stock levels to ensure continuity of supply to our customers.

Our core values are openness, honesty and transparency and with that in mind we make this voluntary statement regarding the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

We are committed to preventing acts of modern slavery and human trafficking from occurring within our business and supply chain.
